A May Altar.

Choose a room in the home where you can set up your altar.

Perhaps a corner of the hallway or an area in a bedroom. Find a flat surface that will act as your altar; a small table or chest of drawers is ideal. You could cover the altar with a cloth, but this isn't essential.

An image of Mary will be your centrepiece. Use a small statue if you have one, or a picture of Mary from a prayer card or prayer book, or a set of rosary beads or a small crucifix placed on the altar can also help with devotions. Have a chair or stool nearby to encourage

family members to stop by and perhaps pray to Mary during the day. If you have any prayer or Mass cards with images of Mary, these could also be placed on the altar. On May 13th we celebrate Our Lady of Fatima.

On May 31st we celebrate the Visit of Mary to her cousin, Elizabeth. Both were expecting. Mary, God's own Son and Elizabeth, John the Baptist who would baptise Jesus and prepare the way for Jesus to begin his work of preaching. On the occasion of that visit, Mary prays her song of praise, the

Magnificat which gives praise and thanks to God for all that he has done for Mary and for others.

Friday, May 13th: We Celebrate Our Lady of Fatima

This year we celebrate the 105th anniversary of the appearance of Our Lady at Fatima, Portugal, Fatima is a village in the very centre of Portugal, about 70 miles (112 Km) north of Lisbon. Our Lady appeared to the 3 children – 10 year old Lucia dos Santos, and her cousins, Francisco (9) and Jacinta (7). The lady wore a white mantle edged with gold and held a rosary in her hand. She asked them to devote themselves to the Holy Trinity and to pray the rosary every day for peace in the world and an end to the war. Over six months she appeared to them on the 13th of each month with the exception of August (19th).
