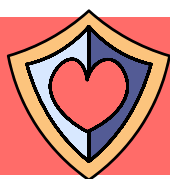
Reflect



In the Gospel today we hear Jesus sending out his twelve apostles on mission.

- What is the Holy Spirit saying to you through this piece of Scripture? How do these words resonate with you personally?
- How do you feel when you think about having a mission from Christ yourself?
- Are there elements that confuse you? Excite you? Overwhelm you? Fill you with peace?
- Sometimes we wish for a different life, or different opportunities; we might think it would be easier to be a missionary if we were a priest or religious, or in a foreign country, but what kind of mission do you think Jesus is entrusting to you, in your life, right at this moment in time, in the situation you are currently in?
- Pray for the grace to respond to that mission this week!

ONE WHO IS SENT

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Gospel reports that Jesus commissions twelve disciples. Many scholars believe that the twelve disciples symbolize the twelve tribes of Israel. It designates, therefore, continuity between Israel and the Church. Matthew lists the names of the twelve disciples, as do Mark and Luke. Matthew also uses the word apostle when referring to the Twelve. The word apostle means "one who is sent." In this context, Matthew is calling attention to the mission that the twelve disciples are being given. They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed.

As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is his continuing presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission.

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CARLO'S CORNER

DISCIPLE OR APOSTLE?

Did you ever wonder what the difference between a disciple and an apostle is? Let's look at the root meaning of the words: Disciple means a personal follower, but apostle



means one who is sent out. The great news is, you're called to both! We talk about the 12 Apostles from Scripture, but we're all called to be apostles. In other words we're all called to be missionaries. That doesn't mean we have to travel to foreign lands. We can be missionaries right in our own home towns, in our schools, our colleges, our workplaces – even in our own families! All that is necessary is a heart that has a burning zeal to spread the Gospel of Jesus. We can do that in our own particular way and in our own particular place: we each have a particular vocation to live out (as well as the universal call to holiness that we all share!) Look at the saints: they had such dramatically different lives and situations, but they lived holiness and carried a desire to spread the message of Jesus to all they met, and they did it in many different ways: some from cloistered convents, seemingly shut off from the world; others from their workplaces or schools; others in family life; others as public martyrs for the faith. What can you do, concretely, to be a missionary?

THIS WEEK'S CHALLENGE:

- Take some time in prayer to honestly ask Jesus what it is He wants you to do with your life. It's unlikely you'll be asked to make a dramatic change right now – but ask Him for the first step along the way!
